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All of John's descendants bearing the surname Hicks are descended from the children of the Thomas Hicks. The Seaman Genealogy (p 84) says Thomas was born Weymouth, MA in 1640, d in 1740. Seversmith gives a birth year of 1642 and a death date two or three weeks prior to Jan 28, 1742, when his will was proved. This seems more likely and given his father's travels, Newport, RI seems his probable birth location. All accounts seem to agree that he lived 100 years, unless for some reason there was a significant delay in probating his estate!

In 1666 Capt Thomas Hicks bought land on Mad Nan's Neck, Flushing, L. I., then called Cornbury, of Gov. Nicholls and divided into three parts equally, to Thomas Hicks, Richard Cornell and Elias Doughty.

William Haviland purchased the latter's share in 1666. Consequently Thomas had for his neighbors, his brother-in-law (husband of sister Hannah) and Richard Cornell and was of course well acquainted with Elias Doughty (who was soon to become his second father-in-law.)

Now the said Thomas Hicks having purchased the Right and Interest of the other two whereby its wholly devolved upon him ffor a Confirmation unto the said Thomas Hicks in ye Possession and Enjoy'mt of the premises Know yee that by virtue of the Commission and Authority unto mee given by his Royall Highnes s, I have Ratified, Confirmed and Granted and by these pnts do Ratify, Con firme and Grant unto Thomas Hicks his heirs and Assignes the afore mention ed Neck of Land together with all the wood land, Meadowes, Pastures, Marsh es, Waters, Creeks, ffishing, Hawking, Hunting and ffowling and all oth er Proffitts Commodities and Emoluments to the said Neck of Land and premi ses within the Bounds and Limitts afore mentioned, described belongi ng or in any wise appertaining. Gentlemen

"I have with very much patience attended to see what Issue you would put to ye Question how Thomas Hicks and the other two, might be accomodat ed with you, in the Towne of fflushing, out of an unwillingness to meddle with the Prudentialls of Towne Affaires?? but being wearied with Complaints on the one side, and finding no just resolucon taken on yor part s, I can do no lesse at last, than to ditect and Informe you, That althou gh the Court at Hempstead, saw cause to settle that part of the Neck up on the Towne of fflushing, for their Bounds, yet there was no doubt made, but that the Towne of fflushing should accommodate those three men with competent Lotts of Plough & Meadow Land, in the Towne, or suffer them to dwell still upon the Neck, as Members of yor Towne. Neither can I conceive what Just excepcon you have had, to delay yor Resolutions herein, since it is credibly reported to mee, That ye said Thomas Hicks and the oth er two, are contented to pay the charge, upon condicon to remaine upon the Neck; therefore I advise you to resolve speedily, that they may with y or consents, either remaine upon the Neck or have accommodacons laid out in the Towne, that no Complaints further may bee heard in this matte r. Your speedy Answer and compliance herein, is expected."

Thomas Hicks is within the Bo unds of Hempstead, where hee hath likewise a considerable interest, a nd is now a Justice of the Peace for that Towne and Riding: These are to d eclare That from and after the Date hereof, the ffarme and Land upon Cornb ury belonging to the said Capt. Hicks shall bee deemed and held to bee wit hin the Bounds and Limitts of Hempstead, &c nor longer of fflushing. Giv en under my hand in New Yorke this 23d day of November 1675."

That Great Madnans Neck has been settled about eight years ago by the Engl ish with many (???)? were settled thirty years ago by John Richardson a nd do not know that it has been claimed by the Indians since.

Little Madnans Neck settled by several families about eight years and near ly 20 years reputed to be purchased under Hempstead and is now under Flush ing all these several trackes were spoken off in Gouv'r Nicolles time aft er Gouver. Lovelace's aryval and particulars discoursed afore them at M r. Hixes the Indians being sent for and present but nothing fully conclud ed onely advised that if they persisted should give to the Indians a prese nt to satisfy them.

That presently after the settlement being twelve years ago (the Pet'r boug ht Mr. Doughtys interest in his third of the said Land and hath inhabit ed thereupon) or part thereof ever since but finds himself encroacht up on by his neighbours Mr. Cornell and Mr. Hicks and is debarred by th em of

having his due proportion of the thirds of said neck so purchased by him there being only three Lots laid out, besides their own accommodation, and the rest left in common which if divided might be better improved. That your Pet'r hath often desired a division might be made of the said neck so that each proprietor might know his share and proportion the which hath been promised but hitherto delayed and neglected.

That now his neighbours Mr. Cornell and Mr. Hicks having settled their sons in law John Washborne on one of the three Lots last laid out Mr. Cornell is settling his other son in law John Laurence on the Commons of said neck upon pretence of purchase of other lands thereby which will be much to the damage and prejudice of the Pet'r. Hee therefore humbly prays your Excellence That a stop may be put to the intended settlement of the said John Laurence in that place, and that some person or persons be appointed to make an equal division of the said neck between them, so that your Pet'r be not frustrated of his right and his Labour on said Land and your Excellency Pet'r shall pray &c. To the Right Honorable Sir Edmond Andros, Governor General under his Royal Highness, the Duke of York, of all his Territories in America, the 24th of Jan'y 1679-80. At a Councill held in New York, January the 13th, 1679-80.

Mr. Richard Cornell, Mr. Thomas Hicks and Mr. Elyas Doughty, with Mr. William Haviland of Flushing this day appearing before the Governour in Councill according to an order of the 20th instant upon the Petition and Complaint of the said Mr. Haviland, that having made purchase of Mr. Doughty's third part of the Little Neck now called Cornbury he was debarred from enjoying his proportion, and therefore craves a division of the said neck, to be run and ascertained betwixt them. After the Record of the Patent was read, and Parties heard,

It being proposed That the Limits and bounds of said neck might be run as directed in the Patent and that each of the Proprietors should nominate a person to see the same effected which they accordingly did.

Ordered. That the three persons by them named, That is to say Capt. John Seaman Mr. Elyas Doughty and Mr. John Hinchman be desired and they are hereby Appointed and Authorized, together with a Surveyor to survey and run the Line of the said Little Neck or Cornbury, according as it is butted and Bounded by the Patent, and Likewise to make an Equal division thereof into three parts Reserving out of the same onely what was at first reserved by Capt. Hicks of which to make Report to the Governour and Councill in the Fort By the first day of March next or sooner if they shall see cause or consent thereunto. Capt. James Hubbard is Appointed Surveyor by the Governor who together with the three Persons herein named are to Run the Line of the neck within mentioned, and to make a Division thereof between the parties concerned. MATTHIAS NICOLLS, Sec'y.

May 9, 1717, I, Thomas Hicks of Flushing some time since did intend to set tle upon my late son

Charles the Homestead that the said Charles lived up on and the Division adjoining to it also. Also one other parcel of land, w hich I bought of Richard Cornell also one half of that share of Salt Mead ow I bought of Joseph Haviland (???) the said land and Meadow lying and be ing at a place called Little Neck in the bounds of Flushing (???) gi ve to grand-son Edmund Hicks son of Charles Hicks 450 lbs. instead of t he land giving as a reason the dispute and contention over the title of t he land. (This record is of great interest as it proves the relationsh ip of Edmund/Edward as a son of Charles and it explains his exclusion fr om the later will of Thomas Hicks. JH)
(Madnans Little Neck and Madnans Great Neck are today Little Neck and Gre at Neck)

This information on the land transactions found in Josephine Frost, "The H aviland Genealogy", pp 27-36

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Thomas married twice, first to Mary (Butler) Washburn, widow of John Washb urn, and daughter of Richard Butler of Stratford, CT. His second wife w as Mary Doughty, daughter of Elias and Sarah Doughty, and grandaught er of Francis Doughty.

Different sources estimate different birth dates for the children and assi gn them in some cases to different mothers in different birth orders. A nd the usual total given is 13. However an original document has been loca ted which clarifies this issue and also suggests there was a 14th chil d, a Mary born of his first wife who died prior to 1713, but left an he ir or heirs. (The Mary mentioned in his will was clearly still alive at t he time his will was written and was no doubt a daughter of his second wif e) On February 10, 1712/13 Thomas executed an instrument for the CT Proba te District of Fairfield, Estate of Mary Hicks of Cornberry Neck, NY, reli nquishing all claims to the Stratford, CT property which his first wife, M ary (Butler) Washburn Hicks, had inherited from her father, Richard Butl er of Stratford, in favor of her children. The instrument specifically nam es "ye legatys as follows: John Washburn, grandchild of the deceased; Thom as Hicks, John Hicks, Jacob Hicks, sons of the deceased; and Phebe Hick s, Mary Hicks, Information from O'Connors of Oswego, NY and over 350 yea rs of Long Island Ancestors

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Sarah Hicks, and Elizabeth Hicks, daughters of the deceased." (Fairfield P robate District, File #2868) The division of property among the heirs is s ubsequently listed and confirmed in the Land Records of Stratford, V ol 2, p 111, as per the order of the Probate Court. (Microfilms of these o riginal documents are available at the Ct State Llibrary in Hartford, CT) T hat leaves Issac, Benjamin, William, Charles, Charity, Stephen, and a seco nd Mary as children of his second wife, Mary Doughty.

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Thomas became a gentleman of much importance, a judge, and active in the a ffairs of the area. There are many original source references to him.

Note also that he was a slaveholder, which was not uncommon at that time e ven in New York and other Northern areas. Several members of the first f ew generations of this Hicks line had slaves, whom they eventually free d. There is a substantial listing of Hicks African Americans in Long Isla nd Records, many of whom are no doubt descendants of these early slaves.

I leave to my son Isaac "my Great History Book which is called Spee ds Chronicle of England." I leave to my son Benjamin, my silver Tankar d. I leave to my son Stephen, all my houses, lands, and meadows, in the bo unds of Flushing or Queens County, except my right on the Great Plain in H empstead; Also a bed and furniture and the remainder of my books, and t wo Hatchells, and my wearing apparell. I leave to my 6 sons, John, Jaco b, Isaac, Benjamin, William, and Stephen, all my right on the Great Pla in in Hempstead. To my daughter, Phebe Simmons, L100. To my daughter Chari ty, L250. To my daughter, Mary Rushlar (sic Rushmore), L100. I lea ve to my grand daughter, Mary Hicks, daughter of my son William Hick s, my silver tumbler. All the rest of my

personal property to my 4 daughters, Phebe, Elizabeth, Charity, and Mary, and to my grand daughter, Sarah Everitt. My Indian and negro slaves, and my live stock, are to remain for my son Stephen. My sons Benjamin and Stephen are to be serviceable to my daughter Charity in her affairs. I make my son Stephen executor. Dated May 15, 1727. Witnesses, Cornelius Van Wyck, John Washburn, T. Whitehead. Proved, January 28, 1741/2.

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Her first marriage is recorded on Vol 1, p 484 of the Stratford, CT Land Records - "John Washborne, the son of William Washborne, and Mary Butler, the daughter of Richard Butler were married ye seventh day June 1655." There was one son by this marriage, John Washburn, Jr. born Nov. 26, 1657.

Evidently Mary inherited a considerable amount of property in Stratford, CT from her father, which passed under the control of her second husband, Thomas Hicks, after her death as trustee for her children. Finally in 1712/13 Thomas released this property to Mary's children in the probate of the "Estate of Mary Hicks, Cornberry Neck, NY" as processed by the Fairfield Probate District of CT, in March 1712/13. (File # 2868 as on microfilm at the Ct State Library in Hartford - Film # 317, Fairfield 1648-1880 in the Series of Pre-1881 Probate Papers. It also bears the identification # 1018754).

This probate file, which was previously noticed by Donald Lines Jacobus but seems to have been overlooked by most Hicks researchers, provides original source documentation of the children of the first marriage of Thomas Hicks and suggests a probable birth order within each sex. It further clarifies just which children should be connected to which wife -- an issue which has been clouded and subject to varying listings in various well-known secondary sources. This file lists all the heirs of Mary Butler Washburn Hicks -- grandson John Washburn (her son John, Jr having died) ; sons Thomas Hicks, John Hicks, and Jacob Hicks; daughters Phebe Hicks, Mary Hicks, Sarah Hicks, and Elizabeth Hicks -- the "legatys" of Mary Hicks.

According to the cover sheet for the File # 2868, Estate of Mary Hicks of Cornberry Neck, NY - it consists of three documents which were deposited in the Connecticut State Library some time after 1929:

1) A "misc" instrument executed and signed by "Tho. Hickeys" on "this (fifth?) day of feb. 1712/13." It was witnessed by Bena Hicks, and John Smonds. Further, "March 2 day 1712/13 then appeared Thomas Hicks before me and acknowledged the above Instrument a gift to be his voluntorn act and deed before me". Signed William Cornell. I cannot make out the text in its entirety but some significant portions are clear.

2) An inventory, dated March 7, 1712/13 of the "Estate of Mrs. Mary Hicks of Cornberry Neck on the Island of Nassau in Queens County in the province of New York ?? which lands and estate are ?? as being in the Comm(?) of Stratford in the Colony of Conocticott as appears on the record." Follows a listing of all the properties with their estimated value (totaling 126=00=00), and appended at the end - "ye legatys as followeth":

I leave to my son Thomas, all the lands and plantation I bought of Richard Chew, with all the 100 acres that I bought of John Hinchman, except the 10 acres at the northeast corner, which I leave to my son Augustine, Also the meadow that was formerly James Clements. I leave to my son, Augustine Hicks, all my homestead that was James Clements, after my wife's decease, Also the 10 acres of woodland at the northeast corner of my 100 acres, And all the meadow that was Francis Doughty's, with all the haying and orchards. I leave to my son Whitehead Hicks, all the 10 acre lots bought and purchased by my father in law Daniel Whitehead, deceased, Situate and lying up on the south side of the Hills, to him and his heirs and assigns. And my son Thomas is to pay to his brother Whitehead $\text{œ}25$, when he is of age. And my son Augustine shall pay him $\text{œ}10$. And my son Thomas shall pay to his brother, Stephenson Hicks, $\text{œ}100$ when of age. I leave to my six daughters, Abigail, Deborah, Mary, Elizabeth, Hannah, and Martha, two thirds of movables. I appoint my wife executor, and my brother, Jacob Hicks, and Thomas Willett, Jr., and James Johnson, overseers.

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Different sources list John as a son of either wife. However, he is listed first of the living sons in his father's will. Assuming that they were listed in birth order (not necessarily so), John is a son of Mary Butler, and older than Jacob, putting his birth abt 1665? Also he was baptized at his Grandfather, Richard Butler's request on May 14, 1676. (This church did NOT baptise infants, only those having reached the age of reason and declaring their faith so the baptism does not indicate a birth date.) See notes under his mother, Mary (Butler) Washburn. Final settlement of the CT estate of Mary Butler Washburn Hicks (property inherited from her father, Richard Butler) absolutely proves John's parentage. I have seen estimates of the marriage date as both 1701 and 1711

Unto my four sons, Robert Hicks, Ellis Hicks, William Hicks, and Thomas Hicks, all my dwelling house, lands and meadows to immediately be sold after my son Thomas Hicks reaches age twenty one, and (the proceeds) divided into four equal parts between my sons, share and share, alike.

Appointed as executors; my well-beloved wife, Elinor Hicks, my loving brother-in-law Thomas Ellison, and my well-beloved brother Isaac Hicks,* and my well-loved friends John Tallman and Benjamin Thorne. Witnesses: Samuel Stringham, William Van Wyck; Humphrey.

*(in orig Abstract, listed as John Hicks, corrected later to the correct Isaac Hicks as in this original)

There is supposition that some or all of these sons of John & Elinor moved to North Carolina. While there is nothing in this will to prove that, the conversion of the estate to cash would be consistent with the concept that at least some of the sons have moved away and none is interested in retaining the land.

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This must be the first of two daughter Mary's! There is definitely a Mary Hicks, daughter of Thomas Hicks and Mary Butler Washburn on the list of "legatys" of Mary Butler Washburn

Hicks. However in the distribution of Mary 11, 1712/13, her share is listed as going to the heirs of Mary Hicks (who are not named), so she clearly must have died before that date. Since there appears to have been another Mary, daughter, of Thomas and second wife Mary Doughty, who was still alive as late as 1754, this Mary probably actually died around 1693. However she must have married, if she had heirs eligible to inherit in 1712/13.

I had never seen any suggestion elsewhere that there were two Mary's or any clue as to whom she might have married, but I don't think anyone else has found the CT Probate documents for the estate of Mary Butler Hicks. There is no other explanation that fits the various original documents. What a disappointment to later discover that Donald Lines Jacobus had indeed found the same documents and identified this Mary, with husband and children!

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Donald Lines Jacobus in "Families of Old Fairfield", Vol 1, p 354 further identifies this Mary, who married Isaac Judson of Stratford.

Sarah is on the list of the children of Thomas Hicks and Mary Butler as given in her mother's Ct Probate Record as a daughter and "legaty". Further she signed in recognition of her receipt of her share of her mother's lands on Mar 11, 1712/13, and signed as "Sarah Rushlar, her mark" (Stratford, Ct Land Records, Vol 2, p 111). According to Seversmith, her first husband was Thomas Rushmore.

Apparently she married second, three months later, on June 10, 1713 Richard Everett.

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Ancestry of this John Hicks should be considered unknown. Many of the sources on John Hicks incorrectly state his ancestry. There is no proof that John Hicks, the progenitor of this line is the John Hicks, son of Robert Hicks, bpt 1605, or is descended from Sir Ellis et al. Genealogists who have seriously studied the original source material discount any relationship between the two. (See Robert Wakefield, "The Children of Robert Hicks", TAG 51:57-8; and Anderson, "The Great Migration Begins" Vol 2, p 927 and the most complete analysis, Seversmith, "Colonial Families of LI, NY, & CT, Vol 3, pp 1368-1384).

There was also a Stephen Hicks early at Flushing, who is usually claimed to be the brother of John. There is no proof of that claim (Seversmith, p 1373) At any rate, Stephen had no sons to perpetuate the Hicks surname. His will (dated June 8, 1688 & proved Aug 29, 1688) leaves his entire estate to his wife, Ann, and one daughter, also called Ann.

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John was probably born between 1610 and 1615 in England. He married at St. Faith's Church (the crypt of St. Paul's in London) in March 1636/7 Herodias Long. (Hodge, p 64 cites - Liscense 14, London Marriage Liscenses, p. 153. British Rec. Soc.). She later claimed to have been only 12 or 13 at the time.

He is thought to have emigrated about 1637, perhaps going first to Weymouth, MA. However he shortly removed to Newport, RI. He was listed as admitted as Freeman "since the 20th day of 3rd mo. 1638 - and again on a Court Roll of Freeman dated Mar 16, 1641. (NEHGR, 133:201). His RI period is noted particularly for the tempestuous relationship between he and Herodias. (See notes under Herodias) This culminated in him taking the children and removing to Long Island where he obtained a divorce in the Dutch Court. Meanwhile she also sued for and obtained a divorce in the RI courts.

The two children are Hannah and Thomas. It is often suggested that there was a third child, a daughter Elizabeth, but that is based on a misreading of John's will. He mentions my son-in-law Josyas Starr (who married an Elizabeth) but the reference would be read today as step-son. The age of Elizabeth at the year of marriage precludes her being a child of John and Herodias.

He married second, Florence (???) Carman, widow of John Carman, who had been a fellow landowner. His third marriage was to Rachel (???) Starr, widow of Dr. Thomas Starr, with whom he had a pre-nuptial agreement. She had 10 children by her first marriage.

In the Court Record of the Town of Hempstead, dated 3/5/1657/8, John Hicks is listed as a Magistrate. (Gen LI Fam, v II, p 694)

"Early in February, 1665, each town was invited to send two delegates, 'sober, able and discreet persons,' to settle good and well-known laws, called the 'Hempstead Convention' to be held Feb. 28, 1665, where many of the 'Duke's Laws' were enacted. Among the delegates were John Bowne from Gravesend, John Hicks from Jamaica, John Underhill from Hempstead, Daniel Lane from Brookhaven, and William Wells and John Young from Southold." (Frost Gen, p 356)

There are many more references to John's career, not yet recorded here. He was one of the original patentees of Flushing.

The Testament of John Hicks, late of Hempstead, Justice of the Peace. (Surrogate Records of New York, Vol 2, p 91-2 - "Old Liber p. 164-5")

"Being weak in body but sound in understanding," makes son Thomas executor, and, referring to their premarital agreement, "he is to pay to my wife Rachel, L100 in cattle, according to wheat at 5 shillings a bushell." Leaves to wife household utensils, "besides her own wearing clothes, and what goods my said wife brought with her to me." I leave to each one of my daughter Haviland's children, a colt." Leaves to daughter Hannah L100, one-third in horses and two-thirds in cattle. Legacies to "children of my son Thomas," and to "my son-in-law Josyas Starr."

Dated April 29, 1672. The will is also signed by his wife Rachel, "in token of her satisfaction." Witnesses, Jonah Fordham, Richard Valentine. Proved at Court of Sessions, held in Jamaica, June 14, 1672. Anthony Waters, Clerk. Letters of Administration granted to Thomas Hicks, June 17, 1672.

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The best source on Herodias is entitled "Herodias (Long) Hicks-Gardiner-Porter. A Tale of Old Newport," by G. Andrews Moriarty. A copy of John's NY divorce decree is included in this article. It was originally published in "Rhode Island History", Vol XI (1952) pg. 84 - 92. and republished in "Genealogies of Rhode Island Families, from Rhode Island Periodicals", Vol 1, Genealogical Publishing Co, Baltimore, 1983, p 599-605. It is partially copied here.

"Herodias (Long) Hicks-Gardiner-Porter A Tale of Old Newport"

This is some account of that redoubtable and undoubtedly, glamorous lady, Herodias Long, who played such havoc with the domestic peace of several seventeenth century Rhode Island households. Herodias Long was born in England about 1623/24, but where or who her parents were, is, as yet, unknown. She married John Hicks by license date 14 March 1636/7 in St. Faith's, the underchapel of St. Paul's, London, and so on after left for New England. They first settled in Weymouth, Massachusetts, where Hicks was granted land in 1637. Thence they removed to Newport, Rhode Island, where Hicks was one of those admitted an inhabitant since 13mo.: 1638, and on 14 September 1640 he was made a Freeman. He was on a jury, probably in March 1641/2 and again on 3 December 1643. On 7: 1mo.: 1644/5 he was before the Court and bound for 10 pounds to keep the peace for beating his wife Harwood Hicks and to continue bound until his wife should come and give evidence concerning the matter. This is his last appearance in the Rhode Island records. He removed to Flushing, Long Island, then in the government of New Netherland, where on 19 October 1645 he was designated as one of the Patentees to settle Flushing in a Patent granted by Governor William Kieft. In 1647 he was an adjuster of Indian claims and he was Delegate from Newtown to a meeting called by the Governor in New Amsterdam 26 November 1653. On 2 July 1658 he was an Assistant at Hempstead. In 1666 he was a Justice of the Peace at Hempstead and held office until his death. His will, date 29 April 1672 was proved at Jamaica, New York, 14 June 1672.

When Hicks went to New Netherland, Herodias remained in Rhode Island. On 12 December 1645

John Hicks wrote from Flushing to John Coggesha II at Newport the following:

Now for parting what way there is seeing she have carried the matter so subtilly as she have I know not, but if there be anyway to be used to untie the Knott, wch was at first by man tyed that so the world may be satisfied I am willing thereunto, for the Knot of affection on her part have been untied long since, and her whoredome have freed my conscience on the other part, so I leave myself to your advice being free to condissend to your advice if there may be such a way used for the final parting for us.

Seversmith states that she obtained a divorce from Hicks in Rhode Island on 2 December 1643. On 1 June 1655 John Hicks was granted a divorce from Herodias in the Court at New Amsterdam by Governor Peter Stuyvesant. The original of the decree is in the state archives at Albany and a translation follows:

We the councillors of New Netherland having seend and read the request of John Hicks sheriff on Long Island, in which he remonstrates and presents that his wife Harewood Longh has ran away from him about 9 years ago with someone else with whom she has been married and had by him 5 or 6 children. His wife having therefore broken the bond of marriage (without him having given any reason thereto) he asks to be qualified and given permission to marry again an honorable young girl or widow (in accordance with political and ecclesiastical ordinances the above mentioned councillors having taken notice of the above request and in addition to the affidavits and declarations attached thereto made by trustworthy inhabitants of this Province, they find that this request cannot be refused and that they therefore have given him letters of divorce and freed frank widow in the bond of marriage. . . . allowed to enter in accordance with political and ecclesiastical ordinances; done and given in our meeting Ad ut supra. New Netherland and have attached our seal in red wax. Was signed Nicasius De Sille, La Mantagne, Corn: van Tienhoven.

After Hicks went to New Netherland, and possibly before, Herodias went to live with George Gardiner of Newport as his common-law wife and had a numerous family. This George Gardiner was admitted a Freeman at Newport on 17 December 1639, and he resided there the rest of his life. He had been admitted an inhabitant the preceding year (1638). On 9 April 1639 he witnessed William Coddington's deed to William Tyng of his Massachusetts lands, and on 1 May 1639 he witnessed Richard Collacot's note to William Coddington. It may be suggested that perhaps George Gardiner may have been a young man in the employ of Coddington at this time. In 1662 he was a Commissioner. He died testate after 22 October 1673 and about 1677, but the record of the probate of his estate was in the lost Newport records.

Herodias became an ardent follower of George Fox, and in 1658 she, "the mother of my children, with a babe sucking at her breast," accompanied by a girl, Mary Stanton, who helped to carry the child, walked from Newport to Weymouth to bear witness and was whipped ten stripes by order of Governor Endicott. By 1664 she had had enough of George Gardiner and presented a petition to the King's Commissioners, then in Rhode Island, asking for a separation from him. It was referred by the Commissioner to Gov. Benedict Arnold, who placed it before the General Assembly. In this petition she states that upon her father's death she was sent to London by her mother "in much sorrow and griefe of spiritt, and there taken by one John Hicks unknowne to any of my friends, and by the said Hicks privately married in the under Church of Pauls, called St. Faith's Church, and in a little while after, to my great griefe, brought to New England, when I was between thirteene and fourteene years of age, and lived two years and halfe at Weymouth, twelve miles from Boston; and then came to Rhode Island about the year 1640; and there lived ever since, till I came heere to Pettycomscutt. Not long after my coming to Rhode Island, there happened a difference between the said John Hicks and myselfe, soe that the authority that then was under grace, saw cause to part us, and ordered that I should have the estate which was sent mee by my mother, delivered to me by said John Hicks; but I never had it, but the said John Hicks went away to the Dutch, and carried away with him the most of my estate; by which meanes I was put to great hardshipe and straight. Then I thought to goe to my friends, but was hindered by warres, and the death of my friends. My mother and brother loosing their lives and estates in his Majesties service, and I being not brought up not to labour, and young, knew not what to do to have something to live, having noe friend; in which straight I was drawne by George Gardiner to consent to him soe fare I did, for my maintainance. Yett with much oppression of spiritt, judging him not to be my husband, never being married to him according to the law of the place; alsoe I told him my oppression, and desired him, seeing that hee had that little I had, and all my labour, that he would allow me some maintenance, either to live apart from him, or else not to meddle with mee; but hee alwayes refused. Therefore, my humble petition to your honours is, that of that estate and labour hee has had of mine; and that the house upon my land I may enjoy without molestation, and that hee may allow mee my child to bring up with maintenance for her, and that hee may be restrained from ever meddling with me, or troubling mee more." The commissioners, Sir Robert Carr, George Cartwright, and Samuel Maverick handed this petition to Governor Arnold on 20 March 1664/5 "to doe justice to the poore petitioner according to the best of your judgement."

The General Assembly took the testimony of George Gardiner and of Robert Stanton, a Newport Quaker, and a close friend of George and Herodias. Gardiner admitted that "he cannot say that ever hee went on purpose before any magistrate to declare themselves, or to take each other as man and wife, or to have their approbation as to the premises." Stanton on being asked "whether hee knew that ever George Gardener and Hored, his reputed wife were ever married according to the custom of the place", answered "that hee knew noe other marriage, but onely one night being at his house both of them did say before him and his wife that they did take one the other as man and wife." On 3 May 1665 the Assembly decreed the separation of the parties, but did not find things exactly as stated by Herodias.

Whereas Hored Long, heretofore the wife of John Hicks, and since the reputed wife of George Gardener of Newport in Rhode Island, by a petition presented unto the Right honorable His Majestyes Commissioners did most impudently discover her owne nakedness by declaring therein unto their honours, that though she had lived for a long space of time with the aforesaid Gardener, as in a married estate, and had owned him as her lawful husband, yett she was never lawfully married to him, neither could owne him in such a relation, and soe consequently that she had lived

all this time in that abominable lust of fornication, contrary to the general apprehension of her neighbors, she having had by the aforesaid Gardener many children... and upon diligent search have found it to be even soe as the aforesaid Hored hath declared, and that by the confession alsoe of the aforesaid Gardener, soe that that horrible sin of uncleannes in which they had li ved for the space of eighteen or twenty yeares together, and had under cov er of a pretended marridge (owning each other as man and wife), being n ow not before, by her own acting and confession brought to light and mo st shamefully expressed to the publicke view, to the extreme reproach a nd scandall of this jurisdiction...

They were each to pay a fine of 20 pounds before the next sitting of the C ourt in October and "the aforesaid Gardener and Hored are hereby straight ly required that from henceforth they presume not to lead soe scandolose a life, lest they feel the extrement penalty that either is or sha ll be provided in such cases." They then proceeded to reenact the Act of 1 647 for such cases, with further additions, and declared that it shou ld be strictly enforced.

At this same sitting of the General Assembly (3 May 1665) Mrs. Margaret Po rter, the elderly wife of John Porter, presented a petition to the Assembl y, asking that her husband be made to support her. This John Porter had be en a Freeman at Roxbury, Massachusetts, in 1633. Belonging to the Hutchins on party, he had removed with Coddington to Portsmouth, Rhode Island, in 1 638. He continued to reside in Portsmouth until he removed to Pettaquamscutt (South Kingstown, Rhode Island) after 20 January 1656/7, on which da te he and several other persons purchased from the Indians a large tra ct of land known as the "Pettyquamscutt Purchase." By his wife Margar et he had a daughter Hannah, who married, about 1658 Samuel Wilbor o ne of the Pettyquamscutt Purchasers.

In her petition Mrs. Porter "doth most sadly complaine that her said husba nd is destitute of all congugall love towards her, and sutable care for he r; that he is gone from her and hath left her in such a nessesetous sta te that unavoydably she is brought to a meere dependence upon her childr en for her dayley suply, to her very great grieffe of heart; and the rath er considering that there is in the hands of her said husband a very compe tant estate for borth their subsistance; whereupon the said Margrett ha th most earnestly requested this General Assembly to take of her and to ta ke her deplorable estate into their serious consideration, so as to make s ome suitable provision for her reliefe, out of the estate of her husban d; and that spedily, before hee and it be conveyed away." The Assembly, "h aving a deepe sense upon their hearts of this sad condition which this po re and ancient matron is, by this meanes, reduced into," directed that a ll deeds and conveyances made by John Porter since his departure from h er shall be void and of no force. On 27 June 1665 he was released from res traint, as he had made such provision for her for life as satisfied her. S oon after John and Margaret Porter were divorced and John married Herodias .

On 1 January 1670/1 John Porter and wife Herodias deeded to William Gardin er, son of George of Newport, 200 acres at Narragansett, which bounded wes terly on Henry Gardiner. On 27 December 1671 they deeded to Nicholas Gardi ner one sixteenth interest in 1000 acres of land in the Pettaquamscutt Pur chase. A map of the land on the west side of the Pettaquamscutt River ma de on 5 October 1705 shows the contiguous lots of Nicholas, Will, Henry, B enoni, and George Gardiner and of John Watson. On 19 May 1671 Benoni, Henr y, George and Nicholas Gardiner were inhabitants of Pettaquamscutt, who to ok the oath of allegiance to King Charles.

John Hicks and Herodias had two children, Hannah anf Thomas, and possib ly a third child. When he went to Flushing, Hicks evidently carried his ch ildren with him. Hannah married about 1653/4 William Haviland of Flushin g. She is said to have died in 1712. Thomas was also of Flushing. In 16 66 he obtained a patent from Governor Nicolls of four thousand acres on Ma dman's Neck. He died shortly before 28 January 1741/2 aged nearly 100 year s. The New York Post Boy under date of 28 January 1749 states that "he le ft behind him of his offspring above three hundred children, grandchildre n, great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren." His will dated 15 M ay 1727, was proved 28 January 1741/2. He married first between 23 Februa ry 1657 and 19 January 1658 Mary, widow of John Washburne and daught er of Richard Butler, who died before 1677; and he married second in 16 77 Mary Doughty, daughter of Elias Doughty of Flushing who died in 171 3. He had thirteen children.

After his divorce from Herodias in 1655 John Hicks married Florence, a wid ow of John Carman, who died shortly thereafter and he married third soon a fter 22 January 1662 (the date of their prenuptial agreement) Rachel, wid ow of Thomas Starr, who survived him. * * * *

Richard Butler --- Father of Mary Butler:

Records from the First Congregational Church of Woodbury, CT (Microfilm, CT State Library, Hartford, CT): This church began life as the Second Congregational Church of Stratford, CT, formed between 1666-1670 as a result of a doctrinaire dispute about "half-membership" between two groups of the parishioners of the Stratford First Congregational Church. Richard Butler was an original signer of the covenant for this church in 1670. (Ch. Rec. Vol 1, p 3). As the breach widened, some members of the Second Church picked up and moved from Stratford to Woodbury, Ct., in 1672. Others followed later, taking their church record book with them. There is no indication that Richard Butler himself actually relocated to Woodbury and he evidently died in 1676 shortly after the baptisms mentioned below. (Orcutt, "History of Stratford & Bridgeport, CT")

It would appear that Richard Butler was in the habit of seeing that his grandchildren got baptised in his church when he got a chance to do it. There is an entry on Ch. Rec. Vol 1, p 8 which was made May 14, 1676 and reads "John + Phebe Hix son + daughter of M? + Thomas Hicks, and grandchildren of Goodman(n) Butler were baptised." There is an earlier entry for the baptism of another grandchild of Goodman Butler on Ch. Rec. Vol 1, p 6 - John Washburn, the only child of Mary's first marriage "Goodman(n) Butler, his grandchild, John Washburn was baptised May 7, 1671. It should be noted that baptism was generally granted only later after the child was of reason and proven faith and that was one of the issues in dispute between the two groups, (See Orcutt) so these baptismal dates do not indicate anything specific about birth dates.

Richard Butler's estate was probated in 1676. Estate documents suggest that Mary also had a sister Phebe, married to Benjamin Peat

"By the sword and the cross," Charlemagne (Charles the Great) became master of Western Europe. It was falling into decay when Charlemagne became joint king of the Franks in 768. Except in the monasteries, people had all but forgotten education and the arts. Boldly Charlemagne conquered barbarians and kings alike. By restoring the roots of learning and order, he preserved many political rights and revived culture.

Charlemagne's grandfather was Charles Martel, the warrior who crushed the Saracens (see Charles Martel). Charlemagne was the elder son of Bertrada ("Bertha Greatfoot") and Pepin the Short, first "mayor of the palace" to become king of the Franks. Although schools had almost disappeared in the 8th century, historians believe that Bertrada gave young Charles some education and that he learned to read. His devotion to the church became the great driving force of his remarkable life.

Charlemagne was tall, powerful, and tireless. His secretary, Eginhard, wrote that Charlemagne had

fair hair and a "face laughing and merry . . . his appearance was always stately and dignified." He had a ready wit, but could be stern. His tastes were simple and moderate. He delighted in hunting, riding, and swimming. He wore the Frankish dress: linen shirt and breeches, a silk-fringed tunic, hose wrapped with bands, and, in winter, a tight coat of otter or marten skin. Over all these garments "he flung a blue cloak, and he always had a sword girt about him."

Charlemagne's character was contradictory. In an age when the usual penalty for defeat was death, Charlemagne several times spared the lives of his defeated foes; yet in 782 at Verden, after a Saxon uprising, he ordered 4,500 Saxons beheaded. He compelled the clergy and nobles to reform, but he divorced two of his four wives without any cause. He forced kings and princes to kneel at his feet, yet his mother and his two favorite wives often overruled him in his own household.

Charlemagne Begins His Reign

In 768, when Charlemagne was 26, he and his brother Carloman inherited the kingdom of the Franks.

In 771 Carloman died, and Charlemagne became sole ruler of the kingdom. At that time the northern

half of Europe was still pagan and lawless. In the south, the Roman Catholic church was striving to assert its power against the Lombard kingdom in Italy. In Charlemagne's own realm, the Franks were falling back in to barbarian ways, neglecting their education and religion.

Charlemagne was determined to strengthen his realm and to bring order to Europe. In 772 he launched

a 30-year campaign that conquered and Christianized the powerful pagan Saxons in the north. He subdued the Avars, a huge Tartar tribe on the Danube. He compelled the rebellious Bavarian dukes to submit to him. When possible he preferred to settle matters peacefully, however. For example, Charlemagne offered to pay the Lombard king Desiderius for return of lands to the pope, but, when Desiderius refused, Charlemagne seized his kingdom in 773 to 774 and restored the Papal States.

The key to Charlemagne's amazing conquests was his ability to organize. During his reign he sent out more than 50 military expeditions. He rode as commander at the head of at least half of them. He moved his armies over wide reaches of country with unbelievable speed, but every move was planned in advance. Before a campaign he told the counts, princes, and bishops throughout his realm how many men they should bring, what arms they were to carry, and even what to load in the supply wagons. These feats of organization and the swift marches later led Napoleon to study his tactics.

One of Charlemagne's minor campaigns has become the most famous. In 778 he led his army into Spain to battle the infidel Saracens. On its return, Basques ambushed the rear guard at Roncesvalles, in northern Spain, and killed "Count Roland." Roland became a great hero of medieval songs and romances.

By 800 Charlemagne was the undisputed ruler of Western Europe. His vast realm covered what are now France, Switzerland, Belgium, and The Netherlands. It included half of present-day Italy and Germany, part of Austria, and the Spanish March ("border"). The broad March reached to the Ebro River. By thus establishing a central government over Western Europe, Charlemagne restored much of the unity of the old Roman Empire and paved the way for the development of modern Europe.

Crowned Emperor

On Christmas Day in 800, while Charlemagne knelt in prayer in Saint Peter's in Rome, Pope Leo III seized a golden crown from the altar and placed it on the bowed head of the king. The throng in the church shouted, "To Charles the August, crowned by God, great and pacific emperor, long life and victory!"

Charlemagne is said to have been surprised by the coronation, declaring that he would not have come into the church had he known the pope's plan. However, some historians say the pope would not have dared to act without Charlemagne's knowledge.

The coronation was the foundation of the Holy Roman Empire. Though Charlemagne did not use the title, he is considered the first Holy Roman emperor (see Holy Roman Empire).

Reform and Renaissance

Charlemagne had deep sympathy for the peasants and believed that government should be for the benefit of the governed. When he came to the throne, various local governors, called "counts," had become lax and oppressive. To reform them, he expanded the work of investigators, called missidominici. He prescribed their duties in documents called capitularies and sent them out in teams of two—a churchman and a noble. They rode to all parts of the realm, inspecting government, administering justice, and reawakening all citizens to their civil and religious duties. Twice a year Charlemagne summoned the chief men of the empire to discuss its affairs. In all problems he was the final arbiter, even in church issues, and he largely unified church and state.

Charlemagne was a tireless reformer who tried to improve his people's lot in many ways. He set up money standards to encourage commerce, tried to build a Rhine-Danube canal, and urged better farming methods. He especially worked to spread education and Christianity in every class of people.

He revived the Palace School at Aachen, his capital. He set up other schools, opening them to peasant boys as well as nobles.

Charlemagne never stopped studying. He brought an English monk, Alcuin, and other scholars to his court. He learned to read Latin and some Greek but apparently did not master writing. At meals, instead of having jesters perform, he listened to men reading from learned works.

To revive church music, Charlemagne had monks sent from Rome to train his Frankish singers. To restore some appreciation of art, he brought valuable pieces from Italy. An impressive monument to his religious devotion is the cathedral at Aachen, which he built and where he was buried (see Aachen).

At Charlemagne's death in 814 only one of his three sons, Louis, was living. Louis's weak rule brought on the rise of civil wars and revolts. After his death his three quarreling sons split the empire between them by the Partition of Verdun in 843.

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Charlemagne, his predecessors and the people who flourished during his reign left a mark on European civilization that could long be seen in everyday society.

It was Charlemagne who devised the system of pounds, shillings and pence used throughout Europe in the middle ages and in Britain until the 1970s.

The title of Margrave (Marquis or Marquess) dates to Charlemagne's reign, when the emperor appointed trusted noblemen of military background to oversee newly acquired territories, frontier lands known as marches. The word Graf, "leader," was combined with march, and the word Margraf or Margrave was born. The titles Duke (from the Latin dukis) and Count (comte, from the Old French for companion) also date to the era of the Carolingians.

The Carolingian Handwriting that evolved during Charlemagne's reign was developed to increase the legibility of the numerous manuscripts the monks turned out at this time. These small letters,

known as carolingian mini scule, became the basis of the lower-case letters we use today.

90% of the works of ancient Rome now in existence are preserved in the form of eighth- and ninth-century manuscripts copied in a Carolingian monastery.
